The following is a home sales report for the third quarter of 2020.

A total of 60 homes were sold. The lowest sales price was \$105K, while the highest sales price was \$525K, with an average sales price of \$225,464. Average price per square foot was \$135 and average days on the market were 23. The number of comparable sales (settled) and the absorption rate increased while the number of active listings declined. 


