

The following is a Sea Isle Park home sales report for June, July, and August, 2021.

A total of 54 homes were sold. The lowest sales price was \$99K, while the highest sales price was \$623K, with an average sales price of \$237,500. Average price per square foot was \$148 and average days on the market was 15. The number of comparable sales (settled) and the absorption rate increased, while the number of active listings declined.
