Pat Merrill, and her husband Bert, were our neighbors and long-time residents of our Sea Isle Neighborhood. Family, community, and nature were important to Pat. She was chairman of Memphis City Beautiful Commission, President of Chickasaw Environment Association and founding Presi-

dent of Sea Isle Park Neighborhood Association - 1979. In 1996 Pat, along with SIPNA neighbors, began work with the Tennessee Division of Forestry to plant trees in the park. In 2004 the Tennessee Urban Forestry Council certified Sea Isle Park as a Tennessee State Arboretum. Pat passed away February 17, 2021. A true inspiration, she leaves behind a legacy of exemplary civic leadership, the Memphis Riverbluff Walkway and our beautiful Sea Isle Arboretum along the park walking trail. In her honor the Memphis City Council approved a resolution, by unanimous vote, that Sea Isle Road between Estate Drive and White Station Road be henceforth and forevermore declared as "Pat Merrill Place". The unveiling of the street signs was held Saturday, May 22, 2021. Drive by and see them!

**Entryway:** The renovation of the park entryway, the area leading into the park off the parking lot on the east side of Sea Isle School, was completed earlier this spring. Thanks to Sharon Baioni and her people for reworking all the beds and professionally planting and mulching the garden area.

Sea Isle Park Arboretum: Laurie Williams, of the Tennessee Urban Forestry Council and the Memphis Botanic Garden, and her crew of tree experts met me at the park several times to walk the tree trail and identify the trees in preparation for our arboretum re-certification. We used the information I had from our last certification effort five years ago, information provided by Molly and Phillip Laster about memorial tree plantings and tree additions. In addition, we utilized the original arboretum map from the 1990's, in an effort to get this process taken care of as efficiently as possible. Thanks to Johnny Behnke for digging up the old map!

We have ordered replacement and new signage for about forty trees out there, and will have well over sixty trees accurately identified very soon. The park will be re-certified as a Level One arboretum and I have created a walk-the-trail tree guide which we will publish as soon as the new signage is in place. If, and when, we develop a new detailed map of the trees in the park, we may attempt to get Level Two arboretum certification.

**Additional News:** Bob Barden of Barden Stone on Cherry Road heard about the memorial trees at the park, and donated 15-20 stones to use for memorial tree markers in the future. Many thanks, Bob!

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
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The following is a Sea Isle Park home sales report for the first five months of 2021.

A total of 54 homes were sold. The lowest sales price was \$95K, while the highest sales price was \$545K, with an average sales price of \$246,862. Average price per square foot was \$145 and average days on the market was 11. The number of comparable sales (settled), the absorption rate, and the number of active listings declined.
