Purple Martins:

We had a successful colonization of the newly installed purple Martin houses

this spring, including the raising of several young ones. We are hoping for full houses next spring, approximately 32 families.

The arboretum is in pretty good shape now; we have identified some new tree species out there, plus some of the signage has disappeared. I will be submitting a request for some new signs for those trees soon.

Park Entryway off the parking lot east of Sea Isle School: MLGW has told us we can no longer use the irrigation system that was installed there (long story) when the entrance was constructed. There is no longer a water source there. We are trying to figure out the next steps, and are in communication with MLGW about possible solutions.

The City of Memphis Parks people have been trying to keep up with park maintenance at Sea Isle. Mr. Jeffrey Dennis, the supervisor of this district, has removed two or three dead trees and had his crew pick up huge piles of limbs (storm damage) over there, so we appreciate him and his crew.

The kiosk at the entrance has news from the McWherter Center (thank you Dana Beech!), and about the Arboretum, the Dog Park, and Disc Golf, plus various other community news items.


