SIPNA has purchased 2 new Purple Martin houses. Each house has 16 "apartments", so the Martin colony could be up to 32 nesting couples at some point in the future. They will replace the older Purple Martin houses that were damaged and had fallen into disrepair. Also purchased were two new telescoping poles for these houses, which can be raised and lowered as needed. The houses will be installed near where the old ones were in the northeast section of the park.

Purple Martins are birds that prefer to live in colonies, eat flying insects, and overwinter in South America. They tend to return to the same nesting areas year after year, and our colony should begin returning in March or April.

Thanks to Troy Vincent for setting up the original nesting boxes a long time ago, allowing this colony of birds to get a start. Molly and Phillip Laster are to be thanked for undertaking the tedious task of putting together the second Martin house for us!

In other park news, Hal Lovett, Molly, and I attended a native tree sale at the Botanic Garden in the fall and purchased several native trees that will be planted soon in the Dog Park, hopefully to someday provide shade for the humans out there.

The park entrance near Sea Isle School will need a cleanup later this spring, including fresh mulch. We will put out a call for volunteers later this spring.

The kiosk at the entrance has news from the McWherter Center (thank you Dana Beech!) and news about the Arboretum, the Dog Park, and Disc Golf.

Reminder: Please, no motorized vehicles are allowed in the park or on the walking trail.

The Fitness Area (located on Estate, near the McWherter Center) currently has 10 exercise/training stations. In 2021, SIPNA Board members recognized the need for improvements to this area, including equipment, pavement and signage.
